

MIAMI (AP)—The University of Miami clobbered Florida State 99-70 in a revenge basketball game Saturday night.

The Hurricanes, upset by Florida State last month, pulled away midway into the first half and the first team stayed in the game until it ran up an 84-43 lead with six minutes left. The reserves came in and FSU narrowed the gap until the final horn.

Everybody on Miami's first team hit in double figures, with Rick Barry and Mike McCoy leading the way with 19 each.

But high score honors went to FSU's Charlie Long who hit 12 field goals and eight of 10 free throws for 28 points.
