

Seminole State's victory over Tampa.

FSU's traveling squad, cut to six players because of a curfew violation, came from behind in the second half and hit a deadly 30 per cent of its field goal attempts to swamp Tampa. That left the Seminoles with a 15-10 season record.

Tampa wound up with a 10-14 record because it could score on only 20 per cent of its field goal attempts. Chuck Andrews hit 12 in the losing effort.

FSU's Jerry Shirley pumped in 22 points as he took up the slack left by Charlie Long, the team's top scorer who was suspended in the curfew violation.

Other players suspended for the last game were Dale Reeves, Wally Dale and Bill Giswold.

FSU trailed at halftime 33-30, then outscored the Spartans by a whopping 50-to-25 in the final portion.

The Seminoles finished with just five players, after Cal Hoge fouled out. Shirley, Peta Rogers and Bob Lovell each had four fouls apiece on them at game's end.
