

Florida State's basketball team overcame stall tactics in the last five minutes and knotted the season at 9-9 with a 57-48 victory over Furman in Tully Gym here last night.

The low-scoring contest was won at the foul line in the closing minutes, as the Purple Paladins scrambled desperately to overtake the Seminoles.

Although it wasn't FSU's hottest night, Coach Bud Kennedy found players when he needed them to win the slow moving game in which the lead changed only four times.

Senior guard Bobby Lovell took charge in the first half and got 10 of his 12 points which were high for the Seminoles. Steady Cal Huge had his moments in the second half when his shooting pulled FSU out of a three point hole, and Pete Gonzalez was in the driver's seat during the final minutes when the Seminoles broke away to win.

Captain Pete Rogers was there all the way, finishing with 11 points and five rebounds.

The latter figure was matched by Huge and Gary Schull, giving the Seminoles a 29-25 edge off the boards.

Florida State hit 21 of 46 from the field, and 15 of 20 at the foul line. Furman had 21 of 43 afield and six of eight free throws.

FSU jumped to an early 13-5 lead in the first nine minutes of the first half, before Furman started chopping away with drives by Charles Jennings and Leroy Peacock. The Paladins got their biggest lead of the game at 29-25 with 1:52 left in the first period on a free throw by Don Frye. Then Pete Rogers cut the margin to two with a shot underneath with 25 seconds left.

The lead changed hands three times in the last half as the game slowed to a snail's pace. Furman led until Lovell's drive tied it at 33-33 with 16:36 remaining. Furman came back to lead 41-40 on a layup by Frye.

Steady Cal Huge took over with 5:54 left and hit two jumpers to make the score 44-43. The Paladins never led again, though the score was tied once more at 45-45 with 4:22 remaining.

Then Gonzalez re-entered the game after sitting out the

entire first half. The Miami junior sank two free throws to stick the Seminoles out front for the final time, then proceeded to run the Paladins ragged with his passing and dribbling.

Jerry Shirley came back with two free ones moments later, then Gonzalez swished home an amazing layup with two Paladins on his back. Seconds later Huge and Bill Peacock added two apiece from the line the Seminoles looked safe.

Peacock's layup off a pass from Gonzalez scored the final points with four seconds left.

Ken Doyle and Ron Malmen combined for 51 points to lead FSU's freshmen to a 103 - 89 victory over Manatee Jr. College of Bradenton in the preliminary.

Doyle had 27 and Malmen 24, as five Seminoles hit in double figures. Coach Lake Kelly's fresh have a season record of 7-4.

The varsity left this morning for Shreveport, La., where they play Centenary tomorrow night, then to Memphis for a return game with Memphis State Monday.
