Florida State poured it on in the closing minutes of the first half to leave the court with a commanding 50-37 lead, then came back to defeat Jacksonville University 101-77 at Tully Gym Saturday night.

Sharp outside shooting by Jerry Shirley and Gary Schull plus an all around performance by Bobby Lovell triggered the Seminoles' tenth victory of the season with three left to play.

High point of the game came when FSU team captain Pete Rogers fouled out with 3:16 remaining. The 6-4 senior from Daytona Beach received a five minute standing ovation from the 2100 fans, though he had scored but 10 points.

Jacksonville, coached by ex-FSU cager Dick Kendall, looked as if it would make a game of it until 2:49 in the first half when Lovell's two free throws gave the Seminoles a 39-33 lead.

It was a runaway from then on as FSU poured in 11 points, holding Jacksonville to four in the last few minutes before intermission.

Ralph Tiner, Jax forward from Auburndale, hit 11 of 21 from the field and 11 for 13 at the line to take game scoring honors with 33 points.

Shirley, Schull and Lovell hit 20, 18 and 15 respectively for the Seminoles. Peacock was also in double figures with 12.

It was one of Peacock's patented 20-foot jumpers that kicked off the Seminole splurge, following Lovell's two charities in the first half. Peacock came reback with a goal underneath, then Lovell hit one from the top of the key.

Shirley pumped in a ten footer, then followed with a free throw. Soph Jim Wallace entered the game with seconds remaining and threw in a hook shot with two seconds left to round out the first half scoring.

It was Shirley, Schull and Lovell again in the second half, as Coach Bud Kennedy emptied his bench in the latter stages of the game.

Gene Martineau added 14 for the Dolphins, and Ed Johnson got 11.

Florida State his 471 per cent of its shots from the field and 808 from the line. The Seminoles out rebounded the shorter Dolphins 50-44.

Two other FSU seniors also played their last game at Tully. Forwards Cal Huge and Bob Ek both started for the Seminoles.

Florida State's freshmen wound up their season with a 75-61 victory over Jacksonville's JV team in a preliminary. Ron Malmen poured in 29 points to lead the Baby Seminoles. Malmen scored 332 points in 16 games this season, an average of more than 20 points per game.

Ken Doyle added 14 and Moe Bloodworth 11 for the FSU Frosh Danny Lee had 21 and Kevin Fannon 18 for Jacksonville.

The FSU varsity leaves Wednesday for Deland where they play Stetson Thursday night. From there the Seminoles go to Miami Beach for a game with Miami on Saturday, then wind up the season March 3 against Georgia in Athens.
