

ATHENS, Ga. — Ahead 29-26 at the half but down six points later, Florida State's basketball team surged from behind here last night to tie Georgia 52-52 in regulation time, then go to a 64-55 triumph in overtime.

It was FSU's seventh victory in 13 starts, Georgia's fifth loss in nine.

The Seminoles return home to face high scoring Miami and its heralded Rick Barry on Saturday night at Tully Gym.

The Bulldogs, returning to their fortress colosseum in Athens after a disastrous road trip, saw their losing skein trail them onto the home court for the first time this season.

Georgia jumped to an early 17-10 lead and then lost it as Ron Malmen and Jerry Shirley fired the Seminoles to a 29 - 26 halftime lead.

The Bulldogs, their floor play not keeping pace with their shooting, struck back to go ahead again in the second half, but lost a six - point lead. The Seminoles knotted the score 52-52 with 1:46 left in the game. FSU held the ball until the last second, but then missed the final shot. However, the Seminoles didn't miss in the overtime, outscoring the Bulldogs 12-3 for the nine - point victory.

Georgia hit 40 per cent of its shots from the floor and 63.6 per cent from the foul line, while FSU could manage but 37.6 per cent from the floor and 40 per cent on free throws. However, the Bulldogs were unable to crack the Seminole defense and many times were limited to a

lone shot at the basket.

Gary Schull hit for 20 points to lead FSU while sophomore Dwayne Powell was high for Georgia with 17.

Schull's strong rebounding was a factor throughout. Though credited with 11 recoveries, observers thought he pulled down more. He was particularly effective on the boards in the late going.

Shirley had 12 rebounds.

Georgia led in total rebounds, however, 54 to 43.

The Bulldogs stepped out front in the overtime 54-52 on Pete Martin's jumper. But Pete Gonzalez drew two free shots, made the first one—and Schull grabbed the missed second shot and tipped it in for a field goal that gave FSU a 55-54 lead it never relinquished.

Shirley and Malmen each had 15 points.
