CHAPEL HILL, N.C. — North Carolina's Tar Heels scored more points than any team ever against Florida State here last night as the Seminoles lost 115-80.

A hot-shooting junior from Washington, D.C., Bob Lewis, broke Carolina's all-time single-game scoring record with 49 points, 27 of which came in the first half as the Tar Heels swept to a 53-38 lead.

Lewis hit his 48th and 49th point on a long jumper and was taken out with 2:01 left. The crowd of 7,500 at Carmichael Auditorium gave him a standing ovation.

Gary Schull of the Seminoles also received an ovation from the basketball-mad Tar Heel crowd. The 6-7 FSU senior kept the Seminoles in the game in the first half

when Bud Kennedy's troops pulled to within five points of the surging Carolinians.

Schull, averaging 15.3 per game going into last night's contest, scored 17 on eight field goals and a free throw.

The Pompano Beach native also took in nine rebounds.

The Seminoles are now 3-2 for the season, and wind up their pre-Christmas home schedule with California of Santa Barbara tomorrow night

in Tully Gym. The Gauchos lost to Oklahoma State 59-37 last night.

The 115 points by Carolina topped a ten-year-old record for FSU opponents. In 1935, Beloit defeated FSU 110-88 in the quarterfinals of the NAIA tournament in Kansas City, Mo.

North Carolina, going all the way with a full-court press and man-to-man defense, jumped to an early lead before the Seminoles got into the swing of things.

Florida State also pressed, but a bothersome leg injury kept sophomore guard Darrel Stewart under wraps for most of the game, and the Seminole defense was hampered.

The Tar Heels, who were hitting the basket at a hot 59 per cent in five previous games, put in 62 per cent from the floor last night. The Seminoles had 29 of 84 from the field for 45 per cent.

A surprising fact of the game was North Carolina's rebounding strength. Although Florida State had a definite height advantage, the Tar Heels outrebounded the Seminoles 44-34.

Florida State again fell victim to floor errors, making a total of 23 mistakes. North Carolina totalled 20, but most came in the second half when the game was sewed up.

FSU got another good performance out of sophomore guard Jim Lytle, who scored 15 points and directed the Seminole floor game. Dick Danford got six rebounds.

North Carolina's outstanding sophomore, Larry Miller, scored 20 points and pulled down ten rebounds. Center Bob Bennett, the only big man in the Tar Heel lineup at 6-8, got nine.

Lewis, only 6-3, pulled down seven rebounds.

Stewart, who averaged 12 points in FSU's first four games, was held scoreless.

The Seminoles will meet another tough scorer in California Santa Barbara's Russ Banko, an all-Pacific Coast forward. Game time is 7:45 tomorrow night.
