It was all evening like some sort of king-of-the-hill game. Gary Schull snagged 19 rebounds, scored 24 points and led Florida State in a rout of Loyola here last night.

who recovered 13, spraking the rebound. FSU controlled the boards 29 to 20.

Loyola went 24 minutes in to the second half without a field goal in that period, and more than 11 minutes elapsed before the Wolfpack got its second following intermission.

The early going, however, was pretty rugged, with both teams hit from the field.

Then, with FSU ahead 12-11, Stewart put in eight quick points — four of 'em on baskets following steal — and FSU broke to 24-15 command.

Loyola came back to within four points, but Schull added five points in short order for a 34-28 halftime lead.

By the time Loyola found the range from the field in the last half FSU was in front 54-32.

Barry Geraghty, a Jacksonville boy, led the Wolfpack with 15 points.

FSU hit 30 of 71 field-goal tries, Loyola 20 of 49. Both teams had off-nights at the foul line, FSU bagging just 13 of 22, Loyola 13 of 23.

Had FSU capitalized early on some of its free-throw chances, had Coach Bud Kennedy not substituted so liberally, had the Seminoles themselves not been guilty of many last-half sins, then the margin over Loyola would have been considerable.

A respectable enough team ordinarily, Loyola has been damaged by injuries this season.

The Seminoles, hurt before

Florida State's freshmen got double-figure performances out of five players and defeated Pensacola Junior College 85-82 in a preliminary.

Jim Geller hit 24 points, 18 in the first half, to push the Baby Seminoles to a 46-38 half-time lead. Rich Campbell had an 18-point performance.

Jeff Hogan, Florida State guard who came into the game with a 25.5 average, could manage only 12 points. Jeff Curchin got 11 points, and his rebounding was a major factor.

The FSU freshman record is now 2-3. The frosh meet Manatee Junior College here Saturday afternoon at 5:30.
