A better basketball team-offensively and overall, if not defensively-Florida's Gators cut outa 74-65 triumph over Florida State here last night:

All evening long, the Gators knew right where that basket was, and found it. They hit a hot 52 per cent of their floor shots; 28 of 54, and a solid 75 per cent of their free throws, 18 of 26.

And in the last 91/2 minules, Florida put on a cool defensive show of its own, lim-Iting FSU to a mere four field goals; three of which were by Bill Peacock from far out in the final three minutes and 10 seconds.

FSU sank only 17 of 30 foulline shots, a poor \$7 per cent. Had the Seminoles matched Florida's 75 per cent, it. "wouldn't have been enough." From the field FSU hit a better - than - average 45 per cent.
