FSU's Gary Schall poured in 21 points, pulled down 18 rebounds, and was the only player to score in the paint. Jacksonville's defense was anchored by Darrel Stewart, who fouled out with 1:40 left. The Seminoles had a slight rebounding edge, 38 to 36. Jim Lyttle got 19 points but fouled out with 3:43 to go, at the peak of FSU's rally. Fellow guard Darrel Stewart fouled out with 1:40 left.
