## Two Sophomores Help In Win; Peacock Leads FSU With 15

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Memphis State ended its longest losing streak ever by defeating Florida State 81-66 Saturday night.

Not only did the victory end the Tigers' six-game slump, it also avenged an earlier loss to the same team.

The turning point came midway in the second half when, with the score all tied up at 51-51, Memphis State's two sophomores Jack Remp and Jim Hawkins hit on 15 points straight, putting the game on ice.

The closest FSU could come was seven points with less than four minutes remaining.

Mike Butler, Memphis State sophomore star, was limited to two field goals but 12 of 12 from the free throw line to lead all scorers with 15 points.

High for the Seminoles was Bill Peacock with 15.

The loss dropped Florida State's record to 10-2. Memphis State is now 7-12.
