NEW ORLEANS, La.—Never ahead until the last five minutes, Florida State saw its aggressive last-half rally go for naught here last night as Loyola pulled out a 63-58 basketball victory.

With 4:35 left, the Seminoles took the lead for the first time, 54-53, on Ron Malmen's 30-foot jumper.

Gary Schull put in two free throws to stretch it to 56-53.

But Roger Radecki, a start-

er who had been benched, entered the game and spurred a Loyola rally that revolved around FSU errors.

Loyola shot back in front 57-56 with 1:53 to go, then pushed it to 61-56.

FSU's Jim Lytle cut it to 61-58 with a layup as the clock showed 33 seconds. After Loyola hit two free throws to extend it to 63-58, Schull put in a 10-footer and Bill Peacock hit from far out at the buzzer for the final mar-

gin.

Loyola was hot at the start, hitting 60 per cent of its field-goal tries in the first half and went into intermission with a 35-26 lead. Florida State, which bagged only 36 per cent of its floor shots up until intermission, warmed up in the late going, ended with 48 per cent for the night versus Loyola's 54 per cent.

The Seminoles had trouble snagging rebounds, trailed Loyola in that department 26 to 23.

Schull led FSU scoring with 17 points, pulled in eight rebounds. Lytle had 15 points, Malmen 11.

FSU, now 10-9, returns home Thursday night to meet Jacksonville U.
