Displaying a hot hand virtually all the way.
Samford provided Florida State with an interesting evening of basketball before falling 77-66 here last night.

The Alabama team, formerly Howard University, wasn't out of it until the final three minutes.

Off to a 10-4 early lead, the Buildogs trailed by only two at halftime, 38-36, and were in front for the last time, 47-46, with 13:43 remain.

Chattahoochee's Jerry Hill and another Florida lad, Gerald Danley of Plant City, spurred the big effort. Hill slapped in 22 points, Danley 18.

The Buildogs, now 12-14, wasted few shots, hitting a flashy 50 per cent from the field, 23 of 38, and going 20-for-25 at the foul line.

FSU got its usually big game from Gary Schull, who managed 22 points despite hilting only 33 per cent from the field. He also pulled down a game-high 17 rebounds as the Seminoles had a 38 to 27 edge on the boards.

Guard Darrel Stewart had one of his best nights, stealing frequently and racking 17 points. Bill Peacock chipped in 18 points, with almost all of his field goals from 30 feet out and all save two of his points in a big last half.

The Seminoles dropped in 45 per cent of their floor shots, 30 of 66, about average and were 17-for-26 at the foul line. With Hill hitling four early points. Samford stepped ahead—10-4.—Then the Seminoles went on a 12 - points tear, with Schull getting five of 'em, and were suddenly ahead 16-10 before Samford got back in the scoring column.

The Bulldogs tied it 17-17, then 19-19 and 23-23 before regaining the lead at 25-23 on Garry Harrlagton's 2-pointer.

Stewart state one and dribbled in for a layup to make it 25-25, and Schull worked a 3-points play. The Seminoles stayed ahead for the remainder of the half but Samford was within 38-36 range at intermission.

The Bulldogs tied it 38-38, 39-39, 41-41. Bill Glenn put in two quick baskets to put FSU back up 45-41. But soon, with Clyde Heath hitting for four points, Samford led 47-46.

Schull's field goal with 13:04 left gave FSU the lead for good, but Samford kept scrambling.

FSU lost Ron Malmen on it

fouls with 6:21 to go and the score 63:57. A bit later, with 67:60 on the scoreboard, Samford missed two big chances, failing at the free-throw line in one-and-one situations.

With Peacock popping them in from far out, the Seminoles worked to their biggest leads, 72-50 and 76-74.

Now 12-10 for the season. Florida State next plays Florida Southern here Thursday.
