Seniors Gary Schull and Billy Peacock closed out their college careers in style Saturday night as the Seminoles trounced the University of Georgia 87-69.

Schull had his best night of the season, scoring 32 points and pulling down 18 rebounds. The 6-7 senior from Pompano Beach became the fifth leading scorer in Florida State history during the year.

Peacock scored 21 points and pulled down 15 rebounds. Sophomore guard Jim Lyttle added 11 for the Seminoles, as FSU finished the year with a 15-11 mark.

Ray Jeffords, 6-5 junior forward, got hot in the second half to lead the Bulldogs with 25 points. Jerry Waller scored 12.

Georgia finished the season 10-15.

The game was close for the first 15 minutes as Jeffords <u>put the Bulldogs ahead 1-0-</u> with a foul shot at 19:34. Schull got the Seminoles out in front by stuffing a rebound, but Dick McIntosh fired a jumper to put Georgia back on top. Billy Peacock hit with a 40footer to reclaim the lead, at 4-3, and Don Wix clicked on a free throw, Jeffords popkey and Georgia went back the top of the key and Georgia ahead 6-4.

Peacock and Ron Malmen each hit on jumpers and FSU was in the lead for good with an 8-6 margin.

From here on out the Seminoles slowly increased their lead. Florida State was holding a 29-21 lead, when Schull literally killed the Bulldog's chances, by scoring nine straight points to give the Seminoles a 38-23 lead with

49 seconds left in the half.

Dwayne Powell made a <u>-three--point-play-and-Peacock=</u> fired a jumper to make it 40 at halftime.

Malmen hit a free throw with 17:17 left in the second half to give the Seminoles a 49-29 lead. At one point, the FSU cagers stretched their lead to 30, when Darrell Stewart hit a free throw to make it 75-45 with 5:30 left in the game.

Schull got his last points with a little over three minutes left in the game. He received a standing ovation when he left the game and was replaced by Dick Danford.

The Seminoles played the final three minutes of the game with 6-8 Bill Phillips, 6-7 Don Biggs, 6-9 Danford, 6-9 Ken Doyle and 5-11 Brian Murphy in the lineup.

Doyle got in a free-for-all with two 6-5 Georgia cagers, Jeffords and Tom Duggins, with 52 seconds left in the game and was ejected. Each team got two technical free

throws and a jump was held at midcourt.

- Senior Bill Phillips got the final three points for Florida State.

Schull, Peacock, Phillips and Ken Leakey all played their last game for the Garnet and Gold. They all started and each scored at least_two points.
