Florida State's basketball team finished its season with a satisfying \$7-69 victory last ; -Saturday, providing a 15-11 record for the year.

It was Coach Bud Kennedy's 19th season, and he now has a record of 234 victories and 208 losses.

In retrospect, Kennedy was satisfied with the performance of this year's team.

"Before the season I was very optimistic," he said: "I thought we would be a little better in the won - lost column."

However, pre - season injuries to returning starter Ron Malmen and guard Ken Leakey dampened the outlook.

Florida State began the season with a new offense, designed to utilize the team's height and the all - around talents of Gary Schull, but the right man for the all - important post position was never found. The latter half of the season saw the Seminoles back in their traditional shuffle offense.

"If I had to pick the things that pleased me most, I'd say our defense, our sophomores, and Gary Schull," Kennedy

even though we had over 100 points scored on us twice."

Despite that fact, the Seminoles limited their opponents to an average of 71.1 points per game.

Sophomore Jim Lyttle and Darrell Stewart were regulars at guard from the start. Lyttle finished second in scoring with a 12.8 average, and Stewart was fourth at 8.8.

"We've said a lot about Schull — but he gave us a great effort from start to finish," said Kennedy. "He came back in October ready to play, and no one on the

squad worked any harder." Schull, who scored 1142 points during his FSU career, led the Seminoles in scoring with a 19.0 average and in rebounding with 12.5 per game.

Only Schull and Bill Peacock, who was the third highest scorer at 12.1 per game, graduate off the starting five. Reserves Ken Leakey and Bill Phillips are also seniors.

Stewart, Lyttle and Malmen all return next year along with Bill Glenn, Brian Murphy, Ken Doyle, Dick Danford, Don Biggs and John Bloodworth.
