MILWAUKEE, Wis. —

Florida State rolled up six school records, including the most points in a single game Saturday night by whipping "Pistol" Pete Maravich and Louisiana State 130-100 in the consolation game of the Milwaukee Basketball Classic.

Wisconsin scored eight free throws in the last 33 seconds in the championship game to defeat Marquette 80-72.

Jeff Hogan and Dave Cowens paced the runaway victory as the Seminoles set records for most points (130), most points in a half (78), most points on a neutral floor (130), most field goal attempts (115), most rebounds (88), and most points both teams (230).

Hogan tossed in 28 points, while Cowens scored 24 and hauled down 31 rebounds. Dick Danford added 20 for the Seminoles, Daryl Stewart 19,

The six Seminoles in double figures overshadowed Maravich's second straight 42-point performance for LSU. The touted sophomore, son of LSU Head basketball coach Press Maravich, is the nation's leading scorer.

Hogan scored twice at the end of fast breaks to break open a game in which the lead had see-sawed back and forth since early in the first half.

Hogan's first layup snapped a 77-77 tie and his second put the Seminoles into a four-point lead which they steadily increased as the Tiger defense fell apart.

Ralph Jukkola, who had helped stem the Tide while scoring 23 points, fouled out with six and a half minutes left and the Tigers still within range at 94-84.

Without him, Louisiana State was a different team.

The Seminoles' 130 points topped a single game mark of 123 set in 1962 against Tampa. Cowens' 31 rebounds was one shy of the record of 32 set by Rick Benson against

The 42 points scored by
Maravich gave him 84 points

for the tournament breaking a
record of 70 points set by John
Austin of Boston College in
1964. His 42 points Friday night
was a Classic record.

Thirty-one rebounds by
Cowens broke a single game
record of 20 shared by two
players, and also gave him the

Classic two-game rebounding
record.

Cowens was named to the
all-tournament team, along
with Maravich, Wisconsin's
Joe Franklin, and Marquette's
Jeff Burke and George
Thompson. Thompson was also
named the tourney's Most
Valuable Player.
