Jacksonville University Coach Joe Williams was dismayed by the powerful Florida State offense. "I don't have the slightest idea what went wrong," he said.

Florida State's big center Cowens and forward Dick Danford manhandled the lighter Dolphins front line, and led the Seminoles to a 59-39 rebounding edge.

Florida State led in shooting percentage 57-38, and in free

throw percentage 60-53.

Florida State guards Darrel Stewart and Jeff Hogan both suffered foot injuries under the Seminole basket within five minutes of each other.

Both crashed into the upright which supports the basket. Stewart appeared to twist his ankle, while Hogan suffered a toe injury.
