Florida State basketball coach Hugh Durham got a chance to watch everyone on his bench Tuesday night with the exception of All-American candidate Dave Cowens as the Seminoles blasted a shorter, outmanned New Hampshire five 104-52.

Cowens was dressed for the game, but Durham held out the 6-10 junior hoping it would speed up recovery of a bronchial infection which has bothered him the whole season.

New Hampshire, a young team with several sophomores playing key roles, was never in the game, leading just once in the early going.

in the early going.

Wiffle Wifflams fitt a couple of quick baskets to give the Seminoles a 4-0 lead, but a free throw by Phil Blum, and two field goals by Frank Davis shotthe Wildeats out front 5-4.

But the next 16 points scored were by Florida State and when Brian Horans sank a free throw with 13:33 remaining in the half the Seminoles led 20-6.

Jeff Hogan, Skip Young and
Williams leading the scoring
and Williams, Jan Gies and
John Burt the rebounding, FSU
led 50-24 at the half. Hogan had
12-points, Young and Williams
eight each, while Williams hadseven rebounds and Gies and
Burt five apiece.

At that point, New Hampshire didn't have a player with more than six points and hadbeen out rebounded 27-18.

The much smaller Wildcats had trouble getting off a shot against the pressing. Semi-

noles. Florida State had taken 55 shots at halftime, New Hampshire only 25.

Florida State wound up outscoring the Wildcats 88-38 from the fild and 16-14 from the foul line.

Sophomore guard Skip Young paced the balanced FSU scoring with 18 points. John Burt, who led the Tribe in rebounding with 12, scored 17 points, Hogan 14 and Dale

Klay 10. Two others, Williams and Randy Cable had nine each, and Gies and Ken Bush eight apiece.

New Hampshire, now with a 3-5 record, had one player in double figures, Phil Blum with 13. Blum was the tallest man on the Wildcats' roster at 6-6.

Frank Davis had nine points, ... Tom Cushman, who wasn't a starter, eight. Florida State's pressing tactics resulted in 30 turnovers by New Hampshire, but the Seminoles' play was also shabby with 18 miscues. FSU outrebounded the Wildcats 70-47.

Next two games for Florida State are on the road, Saturday night in Jacksonville and next Wednesday night at Tulane. Miami will be the next home game on Jan. 10.
