NEW ORLEANS, La. -Four players hit in double figures for Florida State as the Seminoles used the free throw line for a 97-94 basketball victory over Tulane here last night.

The Seminoles were outhit from the field 42-40 but managed a 17-10 advantage from the charity stripe for the win.

Skip Young hit four clutch free throws on one-and-one situations in the last 27 seconds

to put the game on ice.

Dave Cowens led the Seminole scoring with 29 points. The 6-9 center had only seven points in the first half but dumped in 22 markers and pulled down nine rebounds in the second half. Cowens finished the game with 114 rebounds.

Jeff Hogan tallied 23 points for FSU, Young added 21 and

Kenny Bush 16.

Bush, starting his first game, hit on eight of 10 at--tempts-from-the-field-and-had-10 points in the first 10 minutes of the game.

The Seminoles trailed 50-48 at halftime and finally gained the lead with 11 minutes left in the game when Cowens hit a layup and FSU led 71-70.

The largest lead the Seminoles could build was four

points in the second half.

It was tight all the way with -the game tied 13 times and the lead changed hands 16 times.

The biggest lead by either

team was six points and the Seminoles had this margin twice in the first half. Tulane's biggest lead was five points.

FSU had a good night from the field, hitting on 59 per cent of its shots (40-68). The Seminoles found the range from the free throw line with 17 of 23 attempts for 74 per cent. Tulane was 10 of 15 for 67 per cent.

Hogan was credited with a superb defensive job on Tulane's Johnny Arthurs.

Arthurs led Tulane with 23 points and scored enough points to place him 3rd on the all-time scoring list for the Green Wave.

The 6-4 forward was averaging 27 points a game.

Harold Sylvester added 22 markers to the Tulane attack, John Sutter 16, Harry Hobig 15 and Bill Fitzgerald 13.

The Seminoles upped their record to 6-4 while Tulane dropped its eighth straight for a 5-9 mark.

Florida State held a 53-30

margin in rebounding.

The Seminoles return to Tully Gym Friday night to battle the Hurricanes of Miami. Another home contest is slated for Monday night against Kent State. The FSU freshmen play in a preliminary Friday.
