

Florida State's basketball team had its most successful season in history, and in the process set 13 school records, tied another.

The Seminoles, who wound up in various polls ranked anywhere from sixth to 14th, cracked eight season team marks, tied a single-game record, bettered three single-season individual marks, and two career records were erased.

The most satisfying records which were set were most team victories (23) and fewest losses (3). That added up to a winning percentage of .885 which eliminated the old record of 22-4, .846 set by the 1954-55 club.

An 11-game winning streak broke the old mark of seven set by the 1961-62 and the 1967-68 teams.

Coach Hugh Durham's high-scoring team averaged 91.7 points, and that mark erased the old one of 90.3 hung up by the '67-68 outfit.

This year's Seminoles were

the most successful rebounders in Florida State history. They hauled down 1,451 missed shots for a 55.8 average—both records.

Florida State's 16.5-point margin of victory was another team record.

The single-game mark which was equaled came against Clemson when the Seminoles romped to a 122-80 triumph. This tied the most points scored at home.

Seniors Ken Macklin and

Willie Williams bettered a pair of season individual records. Macklin hit on 51 of 57 free throws for an 89.5 percentage, cracking the 86.8 mark set by Jerry Shirley during the 1963-64 campaign.

Williams' 185 field goals in 291 attempts for a .636 percentage put him among the country's top three, and also erased the old school record of .636 held by Ray Swain ('61-62).

Two more seniors figured in career record setting. Dave

Cowens bettered a pair of rebounding marks with a career average of 17.2 and a total of 1,340. The old average was 13.4 held by Dave Fedor (1959-62) and his total was 969.

Jan Gies cracked Ray Swain's field goal percentage mark of 50.1 with a three-year figure of 57.2.

Florida State defeated seven teams who made post-season tournaments. They included Georgetown, Louisville, Army, Georgia Tech, Jacksonville, Dayton and Stetson. North Carolina, a team that beat the Seminoles, also drew a tourney bid.
