## GEORGIA TECH vs. FLORIDA STATE

January 22, 1972

Alexander Memorial Coliseum

Tonight Georgia Tech wraps up its current three-game home stand against one of the nation's finest college basketball teams—Florida State. The Seminoles, 13-2 before Wednesday's battle with South Alabama, are rated 10th in the country by United Press International and 11th by the Associated Press.

Coach Hugh Durham's talented club has the record, statistics and performances to back up such lofty rankings. The Seminoles, with four starters scoring in double figures, have beaten their opponents by an average of 91--71 and had won eight straight games before Wednesday's encounter.

FSU is so good, in fact, its only two losses came at Hawaii, one when the officials ended the contest midway through the first half after a disagreement with Durham. Since then the Seminoles have been flying high and mostly on the road, at that. A week ago they beat strong Houston in a true test of evenly-matched basketball powers.

Durham, who recently won his 100th game in this, his sixth year as head coach, said before the season began, "Potentially this could be a very fine team. But potential does not win games, performance does." Well, Durham's charges, a blend of youth and experience, have played outstanding basketball during the first half of the season.

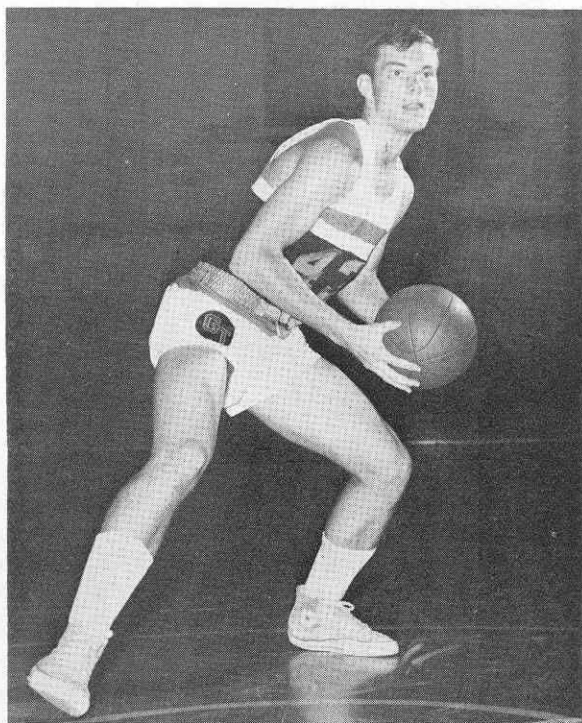
Durham was able to settle on a starting lineup early and it has paid off. Ron King, a 6-4 junior

wing man who holds FSU's single-game scoring record of 46 points, has been averaging 21 points to head the Seminoles' potent attack. Reggie Royals, a 6-10 junior, has scored about 17 points and grabbed 10 rebounds per outing. Senior Rowland Garrett, a 6-6 wing man, and sophomore Lawrence McCray, a 6-11 low post, are Florida State's other double figure scorer at about 12 points each. Playmaker Greg Samuel, a 5-8 senior, contributes about eight from his point position.

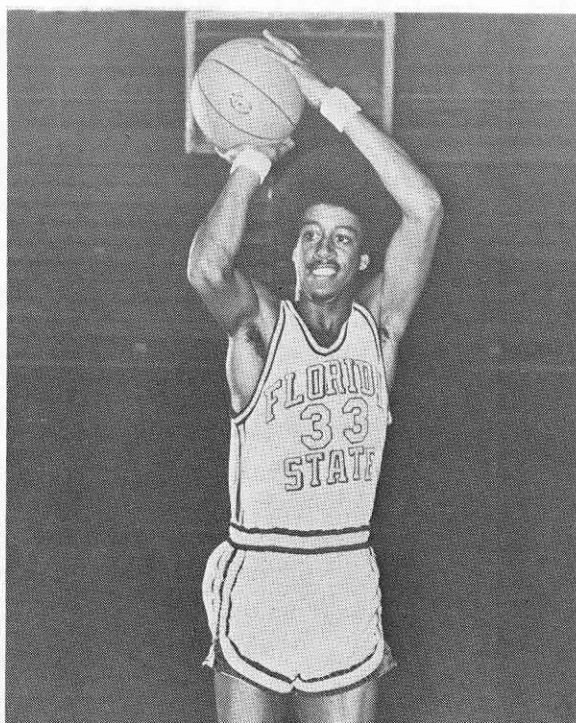
So, obviously, the Jackets will have their work cut out for them tonight. Coach Whack Hyder, encouraged by Tech's solid victory over Notre Dame Monday (the Engineers met Tulane Thursday), likely will stick with his usual starting five. That would be forwards Steve Post, still the Jackets' most accurate shooter and leading scorer, and Bob (Peanut) Murphy, center Karl Binns, and guards Frank Samoylo and John Hoggle.

The Tech-Florida State series is knotted at eight games apiece and there have been some interesting recent confrontations. Last season and two years before that the Jackets won at Tallahassee, a rare happening, while the Seminoles won in Atlanta.

Tech plays at Alabama Tuesday and at Clemson next Saturday before returning to Alexander Memorial Coliseum against rival Georgia Wednesday, Feb. 2. The Baby Jackets, playing in the Queen City Tournament tonight in Gainesville, are scheduled in preliminaries to the Clemson and Georgia games.
