Seminoles 'Gobbled Up' by 91-82

BLACKSBURG, Va. — Hot from outside all evening long, Virginia Tech ripped Florida State's zone defense 91-82 here Thursday night, and that's pretty much the story of the Seminoles' fifth basketball loss of the season.

You get the rather total picture with the word that the Gobblers' smallest man, 5-10 Bobby Stevens, led all scorers with 26 points.

Down by 13 points with 7:24 to play. Coach Hugh Durham's players rallied gamely, shot to within 80-78 range as the clock showed 2:30 left.

The rest followed a familiar basketball pattern. T e c h slowed it down, passed the ball around. Florida State fouled, trying desperately to get the ball back. Tech increased its lead at the free - throw line.

It was more a matter of well - drilled Virginia Tech playing all that well, rather than Florida State playing all that badly, and a sellout Tech Coliseum c r o w d slightly in excess of 10,000 whooped their appreciation as the Gobblers fattened their record to 12-2 and enhanced their chances of a bid to the NCAA playoffs. This morning the Seminoles got out of town early, headed for New York and a Madison Square Garden date with Seton Hall, which should become their 15th victim. Tipoff for the afternoon games comes at 1:30.

At the outset last night Florida State looked much in control, though the score was tight. With the Seminoles getting the ball into towering Lawrence McCray near the basket with striking regularity,

and the junior popping in those short ones, Florida State led by four, at 10-6, 16-12, 18-14 and 22-18, the last with about 10 minutes gone.

Allan Bristow, the Gobblers' top scorer of all time, had not scored a point as the Seminoles' big guys effectively defensed the 6-7 star.

The score was tied six times, the last at 22-22 when Bristow got his first basket with 9:52 left in the half.

But Florida State's last lead

of the game was 25-24. Tech seemed to catch fire after Bristow made his breakthrough.

The Gobblers got the lead at 26-25 on a Bristow pivot shot, and never gave it up.

Ed Frazier, a 64 forward, popped in two straight shots, making it 30-25. He went on to score 24.

"I never shot like that in my life," Frazier said later, "when I put that first one in, I thought they were all going in."... He didn't miss many, hitting 10 of 16 from the field as the team sank a torrid 52 per cent of all its floor shots.

The Seminoles managed to put in 46.3 per cent, but were lacking at the free - throw line, hitting just six of 11 while Tech was potting 13 of 17. Free throws, or fouls, were not much of a factor in this one, however. Tech got most of it in those final two minutes when it would have required unusual

happenings for the Seminoles to salvage it.

Trying to head off Tech's quick push late in that first half, Durham got little production out of a pattern of substitution that normally follows except for Larry Gay, who did well after a couple of mistakes just after he entered.

Tech increased that first half lead to nine, at 40-31, but Gay and Cole spurred a scoring rally that narrowed it to

43-39. Then Frazier got one just at the gun to make it 45-39 as the teams went to the dressing room.

First - half turnovers were costly for the Seminoles, 10 to Tech's five. McCray, who got 14 points prior to intermission, got just two more the rest of the way as Tech tightened up under the basket.

Cole led FSU's effort with 22, a dozen coming in the first half. In the late going the Seminoles cut down on their turnovers, had 18 for the game to Tech's 17, but suddenly the home team was rebounding and the Seminoles were not. The shorter Gobblers edged the Seminoles in that vital department, 45 to 44 ... but then so many Tech shots were going in the hole there were not all that many to grab.

Florida State dropped behind by 10 soon after intermission, crept back to within five and seven a time or two. Then baskets by Stevens and Kyle McKee were followed by a goal - tending c a 11 against O. J. Johnson, making it 76-63 with 7:24 left.

Immediately FSU c a m e back — Johnson, Cole and Greg Grady hitting to cut it to 76-70. Stevens made it 78-70 but Royals scored, then stole the ball and fed it to Otto Petty for a layup that shifted the score to 78-74.

Just after that Johnson swiped the ball, fed to Cole, who was fouled. Cole's two free throws cut it to 78-76 at 3:22.

Craig Leider, the third Tech man over 20 in scoring at 22, struck from the outside for 80-76 before Royals followed with the shot that again got the margin down to two, at 80-78.

Royals fouled Frazier, trying to break the stall, and two free throws resulted. Another stall, with Stevens striking again, finally, from outside, for 84-78 with 1:08 to play. Two Stevens' foul shots soon after closed out the Seminoles' fading chances.

Bristow, who had been averaging 24.5, got just 11 for the night, going to poor 4-for-14 from the field. In fact, if it had not been for his misses, the Tech team percentage would have been well over 60 per cent ... That may tell you something about just how hot this bunch was from outside. Royals, the only Seminole to play 40 minutes, finished with 18 for the Seminoles and snared nine rebounds — the latter total matched by Bristow and Lieder for the other side. Leider and Bristow, by the way, went all the way, along with Stevens. Frazier played 38.

While Lieder had been averaging 14 points, Stevens was only 9.2 and Frazier's 7.3. (The G o b b l e r s played without starter Charlie Thomas, averaging 13.5, who was benched by Coach Don De Voe for unexplained disciplinary reasons.)

A case of a pretty good basketball team, on its home floor, beating another pretty good one.
