

Seminoles Are Beaten In Overtime

South Florida Turns Trick With 95-94 Upset Victory

TAMPA — Blowing a 15 point first - half lead and several opportunities to win it
anyway in the closing seconds,
Florida State's basketball Seminoles wound up losing a 95-94
overtime decision to the underdog University of South Florida here Saturday night.

Art Jones, a 6-4 senior, popped in a five - foot jumper from the baseline at the buzzer to win it and lift the Brahmans to their seventh victory in 15 games. The loss dropped Florida State's record to 11-5.

But Jones almost never had the opportunity to become the hero as Florida State had its hands on a rebound with four seconds showing only to eventually lose it out of bounds to the scrapping USF outfit.

Jack James missed the second half of a two - shot free throw opportunity to leave it 94-93 in favor of the Seminoles. But when the Seminoles were u n a b l e to control the ball, Jones took the in - bounds pass and had the easy five - footer for the deciding bucket. FLORIDA STATE appeared to have things well in hand in the first half, strolling to a 32-17 advantage with seven and a half minutes left in the period.

But USF scored 10 straight points to get back within 32-27 and ended up down by only 42-38 at halftime.

The Seminoles went back up by eight early in the second half only to see the Brahmans tie it at 52 - all on a bucket by Leon Smith, then go in front 53 - 52 seconds later when James sank a free throw following a technical foul called on FSU's Larry Warren.

From that point on it was a dog - fight all the way with the lead changing hands 13 times in about that many minutes of regulation play. It was tied on three other occasions including

at 88 - all when regulation time expired.

It was a jumper by James from the top of the key with 30 seconds left that tied it at 88, and the 6-3 senior missed a 25-foot jumper with two seconds left that would have won it outright.

A bucket by Greg Grady toward the end of the first overtime minute put FSU up by two and Otis Cole sank a pair of free throws to make it 92-88 with 3:08 left in the five - minute period.

But Warren Walk, brother of former University of Florida standout Neal Walk, cut it to a two - point difference with a bucket off a rebound and a free throw by Skip Miller moments later made it 92-91. Miller missed the second of a one - and - one situation, however, and Wayne Smalls answered with a long - range basket for the Seminoles to stretch the margin back to three, 94-91.

That was with 1:40 left and FSU couldn't manage anything after that, Carlton Byrd missing the first try of a one - and one with 12 seconds left that could have wrapped it up.

James scored a game - high 23 points to lead the Brahmans, who just earlier this week had dropped a 100-88 decision to Florida A&M. Jones added 20 for USF, Smith 16, Miller 13 and Gerald Long 10.

Cole led the Seminoles ?ith 22, while Lawrence McCray scored 20 and grabbed 15 rebounds. Larry Warren, Smalls and Greg Grady all scored 14 for FSU.

"We made three mistakes in the last 12 seconds, and when you do that in a tight ball game you're going to get beat," said a disappointed Coach Hugh Durham after the game.

"The first - half lead is immaterial . . . what happened under the basket there at the end is immaterial.

"You've got to give them (USF) a lot of credit, though," Durham added. "They're not as good as we are. But they went out there and hit the hole. We stood around, didn't play well. We just can't stand prosperity."

The Seminoles now face Southern Illinois Monday night in Carbondale, Ill., before returning to Tallahassee Thursday night to battle Jacksonville U.
