FSU spurts out, holds on to defeat Ohio U. 67-60

Starting out like a whiz, and checking high-scoring Walter Lockett all along the way, Florida State's Seminoles finished just strong enough to clip Ohio University 67-60 in Tully Gym Saturday night.

Wayne Smalls, in particular, and the Seminole team defense, in general, held Lockett to 14 points, 12 under his average as FSU hiked its record to 5-2.

Holding Lockett down wasn't all that much trouble for the Seminoles, but getting victory No. 5 came only after some anxious moments in the second half of a sloppily-played game.

In the end, when it really counted, Greg Grady came to the rescue, scoring six of his team-high 18 points, reaping three of his game-high 12 rebounds and blocking a key Bobcat shot in the final three minutes.

All of it was necessary after the Seminoles blazed into a 20-point lead in the first half.

"Then," said Coach Hugh Durham afterwards, "we decided not to play."

The Seminoles, after shooting 52.9 per cent and turning the ball over only 10 times in the first half, went to pieces on their own late in the first half, carried it over for most of the second half and wound up turning the Bobcats back only after the visitors cut the lead to four points with less than six minutes to play.

FSU wound up turning the ball over 22 times, just six less

than it had totaled in the last two games combined.

It was one of Durham's fears going into this game.

"Just too many turnovers," Durham mused afterwards. "That tells me we weren't playing mentally tough...let the ball slip through our hands and

walking with the ball...not shooting...just sloppy."

Durham, however, was not down all that much on his defense.

"We played great defense in the first half, and decent defense for the whole game," he said...

"Smalls did a heckuva job on Lockett," he added.

With Eugene Harris first, and then later Carlton Byrd, forcing the OU point guard to take the ball away from Lockett's side of the floor, the Seminoles held the 6-4 jun-

ior to his lowest point total of the season.

He didn't score his first field goal until the game was almost 10 minutes old, having gotten his hands on the ball only twice up until that point.

Meanwhile, the Seminoles' offense was clicking along, picking apart first a man-to-man and then a zone defense with ease.

It was so easy at that point, the Seminoles built a 22-9 lead after 11 minutes and stretched it to 39-19 with 2:40 left in the half.

And, then things fell apart.

The Bobcats scored eight unanswered points the rest of the half, and then completed an 18-2 run during the first four minutes of the second half to get to within four points at 41-37.

OU was never to get any closer, but it was still behind by only that same four points when Smalls hit a 10-foot jumper with 5:07 left.

After Zach Perkins got a layup off a Smalls steal and Larry Warren followed up a missed shot, Grady took over.

The 6-9 junior grabbed a rebound, scored an inside field goal, blocked a shot, grabbed a rebound, hit a free throw, scored in close and got another free throw.

It offset anything more the Bobcats could come up with.
