

When Jim Williams describes his team, you listen. Considering that Williams has been around at Colorado State only two years less than Ralph Miller, Dick Harter, Tex Winter, Gerald Myers and John Cinicola have been at their schools combined, well, he should know pretty well what he's talking about.

Williams was the head coach of the Rams when Dick Harter was one year out of the University of Pennsylvania; Myers was still in high school.

In those 21 years since he took command in 1954, Williams has won

290 games, been to the NIT twice and been to the NCAA playoffs four times.

Williams will tell you that this year's Ram group has a pair of good guards in Barry Sabas and Terry Larrew, but that he needs help on the front line.

"We will not be as big and physical as we were last year, but we should be quicker. Larrew and Sabas might form the best guard combination, but a lot depends on the development of the younger players."

Colorado State has been laying low for the past three years—the Rams had losing seasons in 1973 and 1974 but came back to post a 14-12 mark last season.

Three out of five starters come back from that club, counting Sabas and Larrew. The other is forward Ron Bouldin.

The Rams lost two big men on the front line in Tim Hall and Como Pontiliana, and will need help from last year's junior varsity and two high school recruits, Jack Fisher and Wally Spencer.

With Sabas (14.2) and Larrew (12.1), Williams may indeed have that good guard combination he is talking about. Sabas was a second-team All-WAC selection, and Larrew was honorable mention. They will form the heart of the team.

The rest is a question, and help will have to come from Bouldin (5.6) the two freshmen, letterman Lorenzo Cash (6-6) and junior varsity players Jim Allen (6-5), Chuck Drahota (6-4), David Walker (6-7), Al Baker (6-7) and Tracy Vinson (6-10).

So the Rams enter the Classic as a question team, with good guards and smallish forwards. But in 21 years, Jim Williams has learned well how to provide the answers.
