Seminole basketball

Florida State vs. St. Louis

With a solid hold on the first place position in the Metro Conference, Florida State will defend its lead by entertaining league foe St. Louis tonight in Tully Gym.

After Sunday's 70-66 win over Louisville, the Seminoles ran their conference record to 4-1 and took sole possession of the top spot in the Metro. Following FSU in the conference are Louisville (3-1), Georgia Tech (3-1), Memphis State (2-1), Cincinnati (3-5), St. Louis (0-2), and Tulane (0-4).

Florida State's lone conference loss came to Cincinnati when the Bearcats picked up a 77-75 win at the buzzer. Tulane (twice), Cincinnati and Louisville have fallen to the Seminoles.

FSU

St. Louis, under first year coach Ron Coleman, comes to Tallahassee with a disappointing 4-10 record but many of the Billikens' losses have come to the nation's top teams. Indiana State, Kansas, Cincinnati, Marquette and DePaul, all members or once-members of the Top 20, have recorded wins over St. Louis.

St. Louis battled Marquette down to the wire but suffered a heart-breaking 56-54 loss at Marquette. The Billikens led by seven with less than five minutes remaining before the Warriors rallied.

The Billikens will be playing without their leading scorer in tonight's game. Ricky Frazier, a 6-6 forward averaging 15.8 points a game, was injured and did not make the trip.

Carl Johnson, at 6-7 the tallest member on the St. Louis roster, is averaging 11.8 points from the forward position. Guard Everne Carr, averaging 10.8 points a contest, is the only other player scoring in double digits.

Craig Shaver at forward, Howard Jackson at center and Mark Alcorn at guard round out the starting lineup.

FSU.

Florida State's Harry Davis is expected to return to the starting lineup tonight after missing the Louisville game. Davis, who continues to lead the Seminoles with a 19.7 scoring average, sustained an ankle injury in practice and did not dress for the U. L. contest.

Mickey Dillard, the Tribe's Super Sub, came off the bench to spark the Louisville win and earn himself Metro Conference "Player of the Week" honors. He tossed in 26 points, including six of FSU's last eight, to pace the Seminole attack. Dillard is averaging 14.3 points a game. Forward David Thompson is averaging 11.2 a game while guard Eugene Harris is chipping in 11.4 per contest.

THE OFFICIALS--Robert "Poochie" Hartsfield (Atlanta, Ga.) and Bill Bennett (Valdosta, Ga.) both assigned by the Metro Conference.

THE COACHES--Florida State's Hugh Durham is in his 12th season of coaching the Seminoles. In that time, FSU has compiled a 221-91 record, a winning percentage of .708. This is the first time a Durham-coached club has participated in conference play. Prior to last season-when it just participated in the conference tournament--FSU was a major college independent. With Durham as head coach, the Seminoles have played in NCAA tournament play following the 1967-68 and 1971-72 seasons. In the '71-72 tourney, the Seminoles reached the finals before bowing 81-76 to UCLA.

Ron Coleman became the 18th head coach at St. Louis University on March 8, 1977. Coleman is the first black coach in St. Louis history and only one of a handful at the major college level. A 1967 graduate of Missouri, Coleman still ranks fifth in career scoring. While at Missouri he gained all-Big Eight honors his junior and senior years, and finished first in the conference in scoring for 1966.

SEMINOLES RANKED--Florida State appeared in the wire service rankings this week for the second time this season. The Seminoles are ranked 17th in the Associated Press poll and 16th by the United Press International Board of Coaches.

State will be the eighth team from the top 20 the Billikens have drawn this season. St. Louis has been beaten by all those foes and only played one—Illinois State—at home. The Billikens bowed to Illinois State, ranked #20 this week, 90-84. Teams in the top 20 this week who have beaten St. Louis include #2 Marquette (56-54), #6 Kansas (85-65), #13 Indiana State (84-68), #19 DePaul (100-81) and Illinois State. Cincinnati (66-55) and Detroit (69-61) were in the top 10 when they beat the Billikens.

DAVIS & THOMPSON AMONG LEADERS—Seminoles Harry Davis and David Thompson are among the career scoring and rebounding leaders for FSU. Davis currently ranks eighth in scoring with 1,263 points while Thompson is 13th at 1,086. In the rebounding department, Davis is seventh with 653 caroms while Thompson is in the 11th spot at 527.

JOHNSON NEARS MILESTONE--St. Louis forward Carl Johnson needs to score nine points tonight to reach 1,000 for his career. Johnson currently ranks 11th on the Billiken all-time list and 27 more markers will tie him for 10th. Johnson has also pulled down 612 rebounds in his career and needs nine more to gain the 10th position on the career listing.

STREAKERS--Florida State and St. Louis are both working on streaks. The Seminoles like theirs--five consecutive victories--but St. Louis has four consecutive losses. Florida State began the season with eight straight wins.
