Valparaiso 83 , Florida State 77

\*After falling behind 5-0 in the opening minutes of the first half, Valparaiso scored eight unanswered points to get back in the game.

\*Valparaiso, on the strength of a 12-2 run, led 12-7 with 14:47 remaining in the first half.

\*Florida State went on a 15-0 run over a span of three minutes to take a 27-19 first half lead with just under eight minutes until intermission.

\*Both teams combined for 11 three-pointers in the first half (Valpo 5-9 56%, FSU 6-10 60%).

\*After trailing by as many as nine points, Valpo pulled within one with two minutes remaining in the first half.

\*Valparaiso's Marko Punda is the cousin of Chicago Bulls star Toni Kukoc.

\*Both teams shot over 50 percent from the perimeter in the first half (Valpo 8-16 50%, FSU 10-17 59%).

\*The Crusaders opened the second half with a 12-4 run to take a 50-46 lead with 15:07 remaining in the game.

\*FSU went on an 11-2 run to regain the lead, 67-66, at the 4:54 mark of the second half.

\*With 2:49 remaining Jamie Sykes' free throws pulled Valparaiso within one, 71-70.

\*In the second half, Valparaiso did not score a point off the fast break. Florida State scored eight.

\*With 35.7 seconds left in regulation, Zoran Viskovic pulled the Crusaders within one with a pair of free throws.

\*An over-the-back call on Florida State allowed Bill Jenkins to tie the game at 75 all with 30.5 seconds to go.

\*Valparaiso outscored Florida State, 8-2, in overtime.

\*The average time of possession before Valparaiso shot the ball was 16.1 seconds (in the first half 15 seconds; in the second half 17.6 seconds, and in OT it was 15.6.)

\*The average time of possession before Florida State shot the ball was 13.4 seconds (in the first half 12 seconds; in the second half 12.4, and in OT it was 15.8)

They had suffered a separated shoulder, bruised ribs and a broken nose in their quest for a berth in the Sweet 16.

This was real pain:

It dropped Corey Louis to his knees and doubled over LaMarr Greer. It left both seniors motionless for what seemed an eternity as Valparaiso players danced nearby and kept the pumpkin out of sight for at least one more game.

Cinderella stuck out her leg and FSU fell hard, and right out of the NCAA Midwest Regional.

Two days after showing it belonged in this tournament, FSU was defeated 83-77 in overtime Sunday by a Valparaiso team that demonstrated that it also belonged.

"It definitely gives you a sour taste in your mouth," said FSU's Terrell Baker, playing with a separated shoulder. "It hurts but I don't think it puts a damper on the season."

Louis said simply: "This loss is the toughest."

FSU was playing for its third trip to the Sweet 16 this decade and first since 1993. It was trying to win two straight games for the first time since mid-January when it defeated Georgia Tech and Wake Forest.

Valparaiso (23-9) will be touted as the NCAA Tournament's luckiest team after Bryce Drew made a buzzer-beater against Mississippi in

first-round action on Friday the 13th. The Crusaders won their 13th straight on Sunday to become the first 13th seed to make the Sweet 16 since 1988. They will play No. 8 seed Rhode Island, which shocked No. 1 seed Kansas, Friday in St. Louis.

Sunday's win over 12th seed FSU had nothing to do with luck. It had everything to do with the Crusaders' Drew, and FSU's missed opportunities and missed offensive rebounds. The Crusaders scored eight crucial second-chance points to FSU's four. That is why FSU finished 18-14 — and a free-throw shy of the Sweet 16 — under first-year coach Steve Robinson.

With 31 seconds left in regulation, FSU's Kerry Thompson missed the front end of a one-and-one with the Seminoles ahead 75-74. A second later, Valpo's Bill Jen-

kins was fouled by Randell Jackson in pursuit of the rebound. Jenkins made one free throw to tie the score and set up one more chance for FSU with 24.8 seconds remaining.

During the timeout FSU drew up a play that called for either Louis or an outside shot by Baker. But an errant pass by Jackson helped send the play awry to force overtime.

"We had to kind of force it up and that put Kerry in a tough situation," Baker said.

The loss left more than just FSU players and fans wondering what could have been for the Seminoles.

"Florida State could have won and Steve Robinson could have been playing Roy Williams," said Rhode Island coach Jim Harrick, whose team defeated Williams' Kansas Jayhawks later Sunday.

Instead, both Kansas and FSU were sent out of the Midwest Regional. Reeling in pain.
