FSU Divides Diamond Series With Choctaws

CLINTON, Miss., Apr. 17.—The Florida State University Seminoles split their two game series with the Mississippi Choctaws here winning Friday's opener 6-5 and bowing in the finale Saturday afternoon 7-6.

The two teams had previously divided an early series played in the Florida capital.

Wayne Howell pitched the Seminoles to their second win of the season in the Friday tilt when he spaced out nine Choctaw blows to gain a tight one-run decision over a pair of Mississippi hurlers.

The Seminoles picked up their scores in two-run clusters in the first, fifth and eighth to overcome early Choctaw leads.

In the nightcap the Choctaws broke a 6-6 deadlock in the last half of the ninth to push the winning run across the plate.

Beard and Ross, who divided mound duties for the Choctaws, were touched for ten blows, but staggered in over the combined efforts of Howdy Calhoun, Knight and Wynn who worked for FSU.
