Calhoun Hurls FSUto 5-2 Win

(Special to Democrat) STATESBORO, Ga.—The Florida State University baseball nine broke their two-game losing streak Friday afternoon against the Georgia Teachers College winning by a 5-2 margin in States-Séminole hurler, Howard boro. "Howdy" Calhoun who toiled for Coach Charlie Armstrong's squad, limited the Georgians to five hits and he fanned fifteen men.

Calhoun was in serious trouble only in the seventh inning when GIC started a fally with a two-run uprising. The Indians had two miscues in the field throughout the game, tightening down whenever the Teachers threatened.

Murphy Homers The Seminoles got to Georgia pitcher, Hall, in the first stanza when they tallied twice, then in the fifth Dago Murphy, husky outfielder from Sneads, poled the big blow of the game, a home run with one man shoard to rive with one man aboard, to give Calhoun's 4-0 lead. The round-tripper was the first one of the year for Fiorida Siale.

Affinitrong's charges pushed across an additional tally in the eighth inning to run the score

up to 5-2.

The two game series with the Teachers was the first activity for FSU since their loss to Troy State 3-2 on April 28. The victory gives Calhoun a season's record of three wins and two losses.
