FSU SLATES FINAL TILT

Meet Troy Tonight: Take Opener 6-5

Coach Charlie Armstrong's Florida State University diamond squad is slated to meet Troy's Red Wave in Centennial field tonight at 8:15 in the final tilt of the Seminoles' initial baseball campaign.

Armstrong indicated early today that he would send right-handed fastball ace Howdy Calhoun to the mound tonight as the Seminoles aim toward their tenth victory against eight setbacks.

Seventh Inning Score

The Indians racked up their ninth win of the season yesterday afternoon when they pushed over a seventh-inning tally to break a 5-5 deadlock and take the opening game of the series from the Wave 6-5.

Led by centerfielder Lamar Brown, who had a perfect day with two doubles and a single in three official trips to the plate, the Seminoles chipped away at Clark to overcome an early Troy lead and take the decision.

Witt's Fourth

Righthander John Witt, who went all the way on the Seminole hill to achieve his fourth win against a lone defeat, survived a shaky start that saw the Wave push over four of their scores in the first three frames.

Witt, touched for 11 blows, struck out seven and passed five in racking up his win.

Clark, who went the route for Troy, allowed nine blows, struck out five and passed an equal number.
