Sessions, a lanky freshman getting his first test in the college ranks, hurled the first five frames to get credit for the win. His batterymate Nettles worked a flawless game back of the bat and chipped in with three hits in four trips to the plate.

Bailey Homers Again

Lockard, another first year man, pitched four hitless innings in relief in his collegiate debut, and Bailey socked his second home run of the young season.

Bailey, who led off with a circuit wallop in the opener with the Chocoma, pounded his four-master in the seventh when he led off with a drive to centerfield. In addition to his circuit, Bailey slammed two singles.

FSU came from behind in the fifth with a four-run burst to take a 6-4 lead, and they followed with five runs in the sixth and two more in the seventh.

Coach Charlie Armstrong's Indians return to the wars Friday afternoon when they play the Rollins Tars in the opener of a two-game series. The finale is slated Saturday.
