

Rollins Sweeps Series With Seminole Nine

Rollins College swept a two-game series here Friday and Saturday from Florida State University. The Tars won Friday's contest by a 14-2 margin behind the four-hit pitching of Big John Gray. Coach Joe Justice's Rollins nine topped FSU 6-4 in Saturday's fracas.

Frank Natolis was the big gun in the series, hitting safely five times in nine trips to the plate.

Roasty Truluck paced the Seminoles with four hits in nine times at bat. Truluck, an outfielder on the United States softball champions, the Clearwater Bombers, also out-hit Bomber teammate Harry Hancock. Hancock collected two hits in six times at bat. Hancock catches the famous softball pitcher, Herb Dudley.

In Friday's game, the Tars pounded freshmen hurlers, Ed Sessions and Ed Lockard, for 15 hits. In the meantime, Gray set Florida State down on four hits; he struck out 10 and walked 2. Sessions was charged with the loss.

Seventh Inning Rally

FSU scored all their runs in the seventh. Augie Pompella led off with a triple to right and scored on an error at third base. Glenn Gresham reached first on Gray's error, went to third on Ronald Melton's infield out, and scored on a passed ball by Rollins catcher, Buddy MacBride.

Rollins scored four in the third on Gray's single. Buzzy Roderbaugh's outfield fly and an error by Truluck. The Tars marked up four more runs in the fourth on Buddy Tate's double, an error by Lamar Brown and Dick Williams' infield out. The high scoring Tars chalked up three more in the sixth of Roderbaugh's single. MacBride's outfield fly and Melton's error at the plate.

Williams Homers

In Saturday's game, Williams drove in four Rollins runs with a double and a long home run

afternoon—as he handcuffed the Seminoles with 4 hits while his teammates were collecting 15 safeties off the combined slants of FSU freshmen Ed Sessions and Ed Lockard. The tall Tar hurler lost his bid for a shutout in the seventh frame when Florida State got two unearned runs.

Pompella Triples

Second baseman Lyle Chambers and outfielder Francis Natolis paced the Rollins attack with three hits apiece. Harry Hancock, Buddy MacBride and Buddy Tate poled doubles for the Tars.

Shortstop Augie Pompella gathered two of Florida State's four hits, one of his blows going for a triple in the seventh inning when Rollins right fielder Buzzy Roderbaugh lost the ball in the sun.

Williams Homers

In Saturday's game, Williams drove in four Rollins runs with a double and a long home run in the third and fifth innings respectively. The other two runs came in on Clyde Stephens' single.

Florida State scored two in the first frame on Gresham's and Truluck's singles. They added another run in the fifth on Augie Pompella's infield out. With Stephens playing George Boyd's high pouncing grounder in front of the pitcher's mound, Pompella reached home before the ball. Boyd was also safe on the fielder's choice.

John Witt made his initial start on the mound for the FSU nine, and was touched for 10 hits. Don Work, the starting and winning pitcher for Rollins, was driven to the showers in the fifth inning after the Tribe pounded out seven hits and scored three runs. Stephens relieved him and set the Seminoles down on three hits during the remainder of the game.

Injuries Hurt

During the series, Coach Charlie Armstrong was missing two of the six boys who hit safely in the Mississippi College series, Bob Trowbridge and Ronnie Nettles. Trowbridge was out with a gland infection and Nettles was benched because of pulled muscles. This caused Armstrong to shift his lineup in every position except second and center. Boyd and Truluck made their initial starts in Friday's contest and Sam Fann made his debut in Saturday's game.

Friday and Saturday the Seminoles will tangle with Florida Southern College in their second Dixie conference series of the season. FSU has Godfrey Knight and Max Lanier set to hurl the series, with the possibility of Sessions, Lockard and Witt seeing action.
