

Florida State University's Seminoles were shooting for a clean sweep of their opening two-game baseball series with Kenyon College in Centennial Field this afternoon, and if today's tilt bears even a faint resemblance to yesterday's frolic the Indians are already "in."

Coach Ralph Matherly's Seminoles caressed the offerings of three Kenyon hurlers for 18 hits yesterday to walk to a 21-1 triumph that was decided in a hectic second inning.

Combining seven hits, four bases on balls, an error and a hit batsman, FSU poured 11 runs across the plate in that second canto to give pitchers Ed Sessions, Lefty Chuck Sanders and Marvin Haynes a cushion that enabled them to ride to triumph without the slightest discomfort.

A single run in the third and clusters of four in the fourth and five in the sixth completed the Seminoles' scoring.

Kenyon's lone tally was fashioned in the sixth when Gabriele doubled and rode around on another two-timer by Hayden.

#### SESSIONS GETS WIN

The victory went to Sessions, the lanky ex-Leon Lion pitcher who had a 5-2 record with last year's edition. Lord starter Williams was tagged with the defeat.

Matherly was due to start big Ed Lockard, 4-1 last season, on the hillock today and follow up with John Witt—if the veterans arm is sound — and probably freshman Mickey Brown.

Kenyon was expected to send Joe Pavlovich to the mound. Pavlovich finished up for the Lords yesterday and worked the eighth inning impressively. The husky righthander fanned two and covered first for the other putout after an error had put an FSU runner on the basepaths.

Ronald Melton, Les Mullen and Ken Smith paced FSU's 18 hit assault with three blows apiece. Two of Mullen's blows were doubles, and Melton had a lone two-ply wallop in his collection.

**SHORT HOPS**—With Five ex-Lions on the team, the Seminoles looked a little like a Leon Alumni club at times. Little Billy "Cooter" Mills, Melton, Sessions, Haynes and Johnny Sheppard were the former Lions in the lineup. . . . Haynes, a freshman, looked extremely good in his three-inning trick, fanning five men. . . . Sheppard, who caught Haynes in high school, was back of the bat at the time.

Three of the six pitchers employed yesterday set the side down on strikes in different innings. . . . Sanders, an impressive looking lefthander with a pretty fair fastball, turned the trick in the fourth. . . . Mike Krusman duplicated the feat for the Lords in the fifth and Haynes knocked off a trio in the ninth.

Bob Trowbridge, 1951 third base star who is now handling shortstop, has been elected to serve his second term as Seminole captain. . . . Trowbridge, a Miami boy who is playing his fourth season here, was captain of the 1950 team. . . . Trowbridge should have established a school record yesterday, he was hit by a pitched ball three times during the tilt.
