

# Seminoles Rack Up 15th Win of Season

The Florida State University baseball team spotted Florida Southern College seven runs in an error splattered first inning here yesterday afternoon, then came from behind to defeat the Mocs 22-11.

The win was Florida State's 15th of the season. The Seminoles have lost three. It also marked the sixth victory of the year without a loss for pitcher Ed Lockard who went all the way on the mound for Florida State.

The game was called by agreement after Florida Southern batted top of the seventh inning.

Freshman Billy Campbell and Junior Ken Smith paced Florida State's 23-hit attack against pitcher Bill Senger of Florida Southern, each gathering four safeties including a home run apiece. Cooter Mills, Wayne Benner and Ronald Melton got three hits each for the Seminoles.

The visiting Mocs got off to a big start in the first inning, taking full advantage of two FSU errors, two bases on balls, a hit batsman and three safeties to score seven times. Four walks issued by Senger and hits by Benner and Smith gave the Seminoles four markers back in the same frame.

Billy Campbell's home run to deep right field in the bottom of the third inning scored Ham Wernke and Smith before him and put Florida State out front in the game for the first time. Benner had singled and tallied the Seminoles' fifth run of the game earlier in the same inning.

Florida Southern took ad-

vantage of another Lockard wild streak to score a single run tying things up in the fourth inning, then the Seminoles came back with four more markers in the fifth. Smith opened the fifth stanza with a long blow to left center that Florida Southern's Tom Smeltz barely got his hands on but was unable to hold, the hit going for four bases. Singles by Campbell and Mija, a double by Ralph Blinn and a Florida Southern error produced the other three runs.

Southern, still battling to stay in the game, got three runs back in the sixth, but the Seminoles used a combination of Florida Southern errors with 11 solid hits to score 10 times and ice the game bottom half of the same inning.
