The regular season of Florida State's 1951 baseball team came to an abrupt close last night when the final scheduled tilt with Stetson was cancelled because of wet grounds.

FSU Coach Ralph Matherly announced the decision some 45 minutes before the 7:45 game time, after watching intermittent showers throughout the afternoon. The contest will not be played at any later date, so this writes fins to the Indians' 1952 campaign, as far as regular competition is concerned.

The Seminoles thus finished with a 17-4 record and a won-lost percentage of .810, both of which

are records for Coach Matherly in his first year as head mentor. His Seminole club is a tired one right now, and though they topped the highly-ranked Hatters on Friday, the boys probably welcomed the rain last night.

# SESSIONS SOLID AGAIN

In the Friday afternoon encounter big Ed Sessions racked up a five-hit, 4-2 triumph with another bit of gilt-edge hurling.

One toss that was too fat spoiled his bid for a shutout as Sessions recorded his sixth win against one loss. Until the eight he had a two-hitter against the power-laden Hatters.

But in that frame pitcher John Ingrand rapped a single past third and then catcher Lou Paar, with a reputation as a hitter, loted a fly to left that just dropped over the fence. It was the only one that left-fielder Wayne Benner couldn't look good on—previously he had cut down one run at the plate.

FSU already had its four runs, all scored in the seventh. Walks and a costly error beat Ingrand, who allowed only three hits—of which just one was honest.

In the seventh with one down,

Benner walked and freshman Ralph Blinn, with the count 0-2, laced a hard single to left. Ken Smith took four straight balls and Ham Wernke walked on 3-1, forcing in Benner.

Sessions skied out to short-center and Blinn came charging in with the crucial tying run. The throw beat him but Blinn was all over Paar and the stocky backstop went down in the dust, sans ball.

The winning markers scotched across when the next batter, Cooter Mills, grounded to short and Bill Johnson, star gridiron passer, heaved a touchdown strike past first for a two-base error.
