

WHITFIELD TOO TOUGH

For the second time this season the Seminoles ran into some righthanded hurling they couldn't solve as Gary Whitfield pitched Southeastern Louisiana to a 6-1 triumph in the series opener Friday.

Whitfield allowed only five hits, the same number Jack Roberts of Georgia had doled out in blanking FSU for its first loss of the season earlier in the week.

Whitfield was good in the clutch, putting men on base in every frame, but never allowing a runner to reach third until the ninth when the Seminoles put two walks with an error and Max Long's long fly for their only score.

Lefty Chuck Sanders, who caught the brunt of the Lions' 10-hit attack, was tabbed with the defeat, yielding eight of the blows and all of Southeastern's six runs before bowing out in favor of Jim Atwood.
