

## Hudson Hitting Leads Seminoles To 9-2 Triumph In Opener

Tightest pitching duel of the young season was in the making this afternoon as Florida State's red-hot Seminoles went after their seventh straight victory and a series sweep from Georgia on their East Campus diamond.

Coach Danny Litwiler leading good after FSU clubbed two Georgia pitchers for 12 hits and a 9-2 victory yesterday, nominating junior ace Max Long of Jacksonville to face the Bulldogs today.

Georgia Coach Jim Whitley, hoping to square things with the Seminoles, called on veteran Allen Parrish to stem a Florida State batting attack that has rolled up 56 runs in only six games.

Long, FSU's stylish righthander, already owns 4-1 and 17-3 decisions over Florida Southern and Furman. Parrish was the winning hurler as Georgia routed Florida, 20-4, at Gainesville last Friday.

Yesterday's Seminole victory over the defending Southeastern Conference champs was a combination of long-range hitting and neat pitching by junior George Hehemann of St. Petersburg.

Making his first start, Hehemann quieted Georgia bats on six singles and was in trouble only once, when the Bulldogs bunched three hits for their only runs in the eighth.

Bob Hudson, Seminole centerfielder, broke out of a batting slump to collect four hits, includ-

ing a tremendous two-run homer and a triple. Third baseman Carlee Hendrix also belted a home run, a 345-foot wallop over the rightfield fence, as FSU teed off for five extra-base blows.

Righthanders Dan Cabaniss and Robert Carter were the victims as eight of FSU's nine runs were earned.

For the third game in a row, the Seminoles jumped off to an early lead. A single by Riley Seever and two Georgia errors after two outs paved the way for a first-inning run.

Billy Campbell led the FSU third with a single over short. Trying to bunt, Hudson fouled off a pitch, took a ball, then blasted a Cabaniss pitch well over the right-center wall at the 353-foot mark.

Hudson's triple to the 400-foot centerfield barrier and Twomey's sacrifice fly made it 4-0, FSU, in the fifth. Hudson's single, Seever's two-bagger, four walks and a bases-empty home run by Hendrix accounted for five Seminole runs in the sixth.

Singles by Calloway, Norman Fowler and Carter chased in two runs for Georgia and spoiled Hehemann's shutout in the eighth.
