

Florida State's hit-happy Seminoles, who wrapped up their seventh baseball victory in eight starts yesterday, went after their third series sweep against Amherst's

Lord Jeffs this afternoon.

Coach Danny Sawhiller's Tribe battered three Amherst pitchers for 15 hits and a 10-1 series-opening verdict yesterday.

Junior Jim Alwood of Hollywood, who has been sidelined this season with an ailing back, was due to make his first mound appearance for FSU today.

BRIGHT WORK

Freshman Tommy Garcia became the winningest Seminole pitcher yesterday, picking up his third triumph without a loss. Using a fine assortment of curves and change-ups, the Fort Myers yearling allowed Amherst only four singles and one unearned run over eight innings.

Sophomore Ronnie Fraser worked the last inning, giving up two singles and no runs.

Catcher Bob Vaughn, who went into yesterday's game with only one hit to his credit, led FSU's 15-hit assault with a double and three singles.

First baseman Fred Twomey continued his heavy clouting with a first-inning, three-run home run that carried over the 350-foot left field wall. It was Twomey's second round-tripper of the year and gave him the team runs-batted-in leadership with 12.

HIGH AVERAGE

In eight games, the Seminoles have scored 72 runs for a nine-run average. FSU opponents have counted only 20 runs, 2.5 a game.

Billy Campbell's bunt single toward third and a walk to Bob Hudson set the stage for Twomey's blast over the left-field barrier near the foul line in the Seminole first.

Successive singles by Charles Hendrix, Twomey, Vaughn, and Riley Seever's chased in two more FSU runs in the third, after Amherst had picked up its lone run on an error and two singles.

Garcia opened the fourth with a sharp single to center and circled the bases when the ball got through the centerfielder and rolled to the fence.

FINAL SCORING

Seever's drove home two FSU runs after a walk to Twomey and Vaughn's single in the fifth. Vaughn's single to deep short brought home another Seminole

after a pair of passes and an infield out in the sixth.

State wound up the scoring in the eighth, with a run on back-to-back singles by Hudson and Hendrix and Harvey Sweeney's sacrifice fly.
