It took Coach Paul Eckley four years, seven games, and many a stormy protest to do it, but his Amherst Lord Jeffs finally came up with a baseball verdict over Florida State's Seminoles yesterday.

After losing six straight games to the Seminoles over a four-year span (including a 10-1 set-back Wednesday). Amherst shoved across a pair of runs in the 10th inning for a 9-7 nod yesterday.

The victory was achieved after "several" heated discussions between Eckley, Amherst's tall, greying coach, and umpires Walt Schenck and Wes Carter. Eckley hasn't been known as a taciturn fellow in past trips to Tallahassee.

The Jeffs pounded four FSU pitchers for 15 hits and, came from behind twice to dole out the second loss in nine starts for Danny Litwhiler's Seminoles.

A single, a walk, and a tworun double after two outs in the 10th against southpaw John Ash, third FSU hurler, did the trick. Righthanders Jim Atwood, who made his first 1955 appearance, and George Hehemann were the victims of earlier Amherst outbursts. Freshman Jim DeVane retired the side without further damage in the 10th after Ash faltered.

Lefthander Ted Kambour went the distance for the Jeffs, being tagged for 12 hits—three by centerfielder Bob Hudson—but bearing down in the tight spots. It was Amherst's second win in four starts on their Southern tour.
