ATHENS, Ga.—Junior Dan Cabaniss, starting the first game of his career, handcuffed Florida State on eight hits as Georgia hammered out a 17-3 triumph here yesterday.

The victory reversed a 14-5 licking FSU handed the Bull-dogs Monday and left the teams tied in four games this spring at two triumphs apiece.

A crowd of 1,500 watched the Bulldogs chase Seminole starter Jim Atwood with a five-run out-burst in the second and continue their barrage against Tommy Garcia and Lefty Tony Avitable. It was Atwood's second setback against one success.

Cabiniss blanked the Seminoles in every inning except the seventh. Shortstop Pfil Hunt, with a single and double in two trips, was the only FSU player who got more than one hit.

Reggie Andrews led the Georgia attack with a single and two triples. Wendell Tarleton got three singles and batted in three runs for the Bulldogs.

Despite the one-sided defeat, Danny Litwhiler's Seminoles won three of four games in their five-day stand against Georgia's top collegiate nines. FSU biasted Georgia Teachers twice at Statesboro last week:
