Outfielder Riley Seevers, 22-year-old service veteran in his first year of college baseball, set an all-time individual batting mark for Florida State's Seminoles this season.

Final statistics reveal that Seevers, a slightly-built freshman from Tallahassee, collected 27 hits in 65 trips for a record .415 average. He bettered by 21 points the .394 figure chalked by teammate Billy Campbell in 1952.

A lefthanded "spray" hitter, Seevers appeared in 22 of State's 23 games this spring.

In its first season under Danny Litwhiler, FSU finished with a 17-6 record, second best baseball year in the school's history.

EDGES TWOMEY

Despite his record pace, Seevers barely nosed out sophomore first baseman Fred Twomey of Gloucester, Mass. Twomey batted 392 and set new school records with six home runs and 26 runs batted in. The powerfully build infielder also had six doubles and two triples.

Three other regulars batted over 300, as the Seminoles compiled a new team batting record with a 321 average. They were catcher Bob Vaughn (366), second baseman Billy Campbell (356), and shortstop Pfil Hunt (333). Campbell led the team in stolen bases with eight.

Southpaw John Ash and right-hander Tommy Garcia paced the pitching staff with identical 5-1 records. Ash, who allowed only 28 hits and 11 earned runs in 41 innings, had th best earned run average, 2.41. Junior veteran Max Long (4-2) was the most active, working 57 innings. Long led in strikeouts with 44.

OTHER MARKS .

New team records set included: most wins in a season (17), which tied the 1952 total; best batting average (.321); most hits (258); most runs (189); and most runs batted in (154). The Seminoles also belted 35 doubles and stole 37 bases for other new season highs.

Campbell wound up a fouryear career as regular second sacker with 32 hits to tie another all-time high.
