

Florida State played opportunist in the eighth inning here Saturday afternoon to rally for four runs and gain an 8-5 Florida Intercollegiate Baseball Conference victory over Florida Southern's Moccasins.

The win gave the Seminoles a

sweep of the two-game series. It was their sixth straight triumph of the season.

COME FROM BEHIND

Behind 5-4 going into the bottom of the eventful eighth, the winners stretched one single, a pair of walks, two hit batsmen and a one-base error into the four runs that iced the contest.

The Tribe had tied it up, 4-4 on the strength of some successful seventh-inning strategy when pinch hitters Gale Tuggle and Fred Twomey singled and Max Long drew a base on balls.

However, the losers went ahead in the top of the eighth on an error, walk and third baseman Norm Clifton's run-scoring single, setting the stage for the FSU rally in the last half of the frame.

COLLECT TEN HITS

The Seminoles combed Moccasins hurlers Walt Krauss and Dick Hagstrom for ten hits. The losers collected six off starter and winner Tony Avitable. George Hehemann, who worked the ninth for the Seminoles, didn't allow any.

Lee Corso, whose triple accounted for three first-inning runs in a 9-2 victory over Southern Friday, paced the FSU attack. The junior outfielder slammed three hits, including another triple and a double.

Third baseman Carlos Hendrix and left fielder Dick Houser each chipped in with a pair of singles for winners.

LEAVES NINE STRANDED

Avitable had struck out 24 in his first performance of the season here against Furman, but was in trouble in almost every inning Saturday. However, the lefthand-

er was tough when he had to be, leaving nine Southern runners stranded.

Second baseman Don Brennan led the offensive attack for the losers with three hits in five tries.

The Seminoles will open a two-game series with Indiana Monday afternoon at 3:30.
