

Three Indiana pitchers walked 14 men here yesterday as Florida State's baseball team won its seventh in a row, downing the Hoosiers 11-6.

The Seminoles built up a 9-2 lead in the first five innings and held off a late Indiana bid to win the opener of a two-game series. The two clubs were scheduled to play again this afternoon.

Max Long hurled his third straight victory but needed help from George Hehemann in the ninth. Long struck out five, walked five and was touched for 11 hits by the visitors. Hehemann gave up two singles in the ninth and fanned one.

FSU TAKES LEAD

FSU jumped into an early lead by scoring twice in the third frame on a walk, an error and singles by Owen McCarron and Dick Houser.

The Seminoles picked up two more in the next inning on Ham run with Phil Hunt on base. The drive took a sharp bounce over the center fielder's head and was ruled a homer.

Indiana scored two runs in the fifth on a walk, two singles and a pair of miscues by Hunt. But the Seminoles broke the contest wide open in the bottom half when Indiana's Albin Hayes walked three runs across the plate. Gary Ashley accounted for two more with a double which bounced over the fence.

Hayes put himself in trouble again in the sixth by passing two more and was lifted in favor of Carl McCollum. An outfield error and Hunt's sacrifice fly pushed across one run before McCollum could retire the side.

The Hoosiers rallied for three runs in the seventh and another in the eighth. Carl Kirkpatrick, 6-2, 230-pound first baseman, smashed a home run over the right field fence with one mate aboard and Lee Corso's three-base boot accounted for a third run. The eighth inning tally came on a single, base on balls and Art Herring's double. FSU's Bob Rosell snuffed the rally by snaring Kirkpatrick's liner to left and doubling Herring off second.

Florida State added an insurance run in the eighth on two walks, a double by Bisbee and Ashley's sacrifice bunt which squeezed in Hunt.

Content with the 11-6 walk-off, the Seminoles mustered just six hits with Bisbee's homer and double leading the way.

Indiana's six-run attack was led by Kirkpatrick's home run and two singles.

FSU's second baseman, McCarron, handled nine chances without an error in pace defensive play.
