

Florida State's undefeated baseball team continued to make use of its spciality—the big inning—here Tuesday against Indiana, taking advantage of of a seven-run fourth to outscore the Hoosiers, 14-10.

The victory was the eighth straight for the Seminoles and gave them a sweep of the two-game set with Indiana. The Tribe won Monday, 11-6.

Outhit for the second straight day, this time 11-10, the Seminoles had to tally three times in the bottom of the eighth to gain a breathing margin.

ONE-RUN LEAD

By the eighth, the visitors had nibbled the FSU lead from 11-5 to 11-10.

After Indiana had gained a 1-0 edge in the top of the second, the Seminoles snapped back in front to stay in the third when

outfielders Fred Twomey and Dick Houser each cracked a two-run homer.

But the big uprising for the winners came in the fourth, when seven runs poured across on two hits—a one-baser by Ham Bisbee and double by Phil Hunt—plus six walks and an error.

Throwing into a stiff breeze, both FSU and Hoosier pitchers were largely ineffective. Three pitchers saw action for each club.

Leftlander John Ash worked

the first four innings for the Seminoles followed by Tom Garcia, making his first appearance of the year for FSU.

Relief ace George Hehemann finished up for the Seminoles and got credit for the victory, his first of the campaign.

The Seminoles resume action Thursday night when they meet North Carolina in the third game of the first annual FSU Invitational Tournament at Centennial Field at 8:30 p.m.

Other first-day games pit West Virginia and Notre Dame at 3:00 p.m. on the East Campus diamond and Illinois and Wisconsin at 6:30 at Centennial.
