PSU held on to a two-run lirst inning lead to overcome troublesome North Carolina 3-2 last night and Wisconsin edged Ellinois by the same score.

The Seminoics' Tony Avitable, in trouble most of the way, struck out 12, walked seven and gave up six singles in paining his third straight triumph of the season.
