

## Two opening day winners — Wisconsin and Florida State—clash here tonight in the Florida State Invitational baseball tournament.

The contest is scheduled as the second half of a two-night doubleheader at Centennial Field. The first game at 6 sends West Virginia against Illinois.

The Illini were also slated to play North Carolina this afternoon.

### TWO CLOSE ONES

Florida State, Wisconsin and West Virginia scored victories yesterday in three close games, with only top seeded West Virginia gaining a wide decision, a 4-0 win over Notre Dame.

FSU held on to a two-run first inning lead to overcome troublesome North Carolina 3-2 last night and Wisconsin edged Illinois by the same score.

The Seminoles' Tony Avitable, in trouble most of the way, struck out 12, walked seven and gave up six singles in gaining his third straight triumph of the season.

North Carolina left the bases full in three innings but the Seminole lefty got the third out by strikeout in each instance.

### FREE PASSES HURT

A pair of walks, an error and Fred Twomey's line single to left pushed two runs across for FSU in the first frame. The Tarheels picked up their first tally in the third on two singles and two free passes by Avitable, the second of which forced in the run.

Florida State roared back in the bottom of the inning with the eventual winning margin on a walk to Carlee Hendrix, an infield out and a bingle by Lee Corso.

The final North Carolina run crossed the plate in the fifth as Joe Shook walked, went to third on an error and scored on Avitable's wild pitch. Carolina threatened in every inning after that, but clutch pitching and a ninth inning double play halted the danger.

A gamble for an insurance run cost Illinois its 3-2 loss to Big Ten rival Wisconsin.

With two runs already across in the top of the seventh, a 2-1 lead and the bases loaded with one out, Coach Lee Elberacht elected to send a pinch-hitter up for pitcher Dick Vorrayer. He struck out and the following batter grounded out to end the inning.

Vorrayer, who had given up only one run and three singles, was replaced by senior Bill Frents and Wisconsin promptly broke the game open in the bot-

tom of the seventh.

Wayne Kelliher's pinch hit sacrifice fly tied the score after the bases were loaded on a single, walk and fielders choice. Another pinchhitter, Walt Nowicki, wrapped up the game when Ron Neiman scored on his routine infield out.

The Badgers' John Rusch had given up only one hit until Illinois rallied in the seventh. Rusch ended by fanning 10 and walking only one.

West Virginia's Jim Haise, national collegiate strikeout king in 1955, struck out only five Notre Dame batters but allowed just three hits as the Mountaineers downed the Fighting Irish in the tourney opener.

#### UMP'S SON LEADS

Edwin Hurley, son of American League umpire Ed Hurley, was able to solve Haise's pitching with any consistency as he banged out two singles. Mike Lesso's double accounted for the third hit.

Notre Dame's Tom Bujnowski, although effective most of the way, was touched for seven hits, two by Steve LaNeve. Bujnowski matched Haise's strikeout total and walked only two.

A four-game schedule is on tap for Saturday. North Caro-

lina goes against Notre Dame and Illinois in a doubleheader at the East Campus beginning at 1 p.m. In a two-night twin-bill at Centennial Field, set to start at 6, West Virginia faces Wisconsin and Notre Dame plays Florida State.
