

Florida State's Seminoles, only unbeaten team left in the first annual Florida State Invitational baseball tournament, face Notre Dame here tonight at 8:30 in the feature game of a full schedule.

The contest, slated for Centennial Field, is the second half of a two-night doubleheader which sends West Virginia against Wisconsin at 6.

North Carolina was scheduled to play a doubleheader with Notre Dame and Illinois this afternoon at the East Campus diamond.

FOUR IN TTH

Florida State came from behind to score four runs in the seventh to edge Wisconsin 5-3. In other games yesterday Illinois clobbered top-seeded West Virginia 9-4 and North Carolina and Illinois battled to a 3-3 tie in an exhibition game which will not figure in tourney standings.

Alert base running and defensive play were the major factors as the Seminoles dumped Wisconsin. The Badgers had upset Illinois 3-2 Thursday.

A walk and successive singles by Dick Houser and Lee Corso tied the score 2-2 in the seventh and Houser put the Tribe out in front to stay by racing home on John Aehl's wild pitch. Florida State wrapped up the game with two more runs on Gary Ashley's bingle and a fluke double by Ham

Blasbee.

Wisconsin threatened in the final two innings but sparkling fielding plays by Houser, Bob Rosell, Carlee Hendrix and Ashley halted the danger.

ASH WINNER

The Seminoles jumped off to an early lead, tallying once in the first frame when Aehl walked Ashley with the bases loaded. Wisconsin came back in the second to score two runs off starter Jim Atwood on two walks and two hits, one a double by catcher Wayne Kelliher.

Atwood was lifted in the sixth in favor of lefty John Ash who finished the game and was the winning pitcher, gaining his first decision of the year.

The victory was FSU's tenth in a row and pretty well establishes the Seminoles as tournament favorites.

Illinois came alive at the plate against West Virginia, connecting for 12 hits including two triples and two doubles.

Sophomore Ray Nitschke, a promising football fullback, hurled 5 1/3 innings in winning his first start for the Illini. Veteran Jim Blockhouse shutout the Mountaineers the rest of the way.

STAR KAYOED

West Virginia's Don O'Haver, who lost only one of eight decisions last year, was knocked out in two innings.

Bennie LaNeve hit a two-run inside-the-park homer in the

fourth, pacing a four-run West Virginia outburst.

Failure to score with the bases loaded lost for both Illinois and North Carolina a chance to win the exhibition tie.

The Illini left the bases full in the fifth and sixth and three Mountaineers were left stranded in the seventh.
