

Florida State scored six runs in the first inning last night and coasted to a 12-5 victory over Notre Dame in the first annual Florida State Invitational baseball tournament.

It was the Seminoles' eleventh straight victory of the season, the last three in tourney play. The win also left FSU perched on top of meet standings, a full game in front of Wisconsin and Illinois who have 2-1 records.

In other games yesterday Wisconsin handed West Virginia its second straight loss, 10-0, behind sophomore George Schmidt's two hits.

North Carolina swamped Notre Dame 14-4 but was edged out by Illinois 12-11 in 10 innings.

Florida State now goes against West Virginia when tournament action resumes tomorrow. The game is the second half of a

doubleheader which sends Wisconsin against Brown at 1 at the East Campus diamond.

In a night game at Centennial Field, 7:30, Illinois entertains winless Notre Dame.

LONG IN WINNING

Max Long picked up his fourth win in a row in hurling the first five innings for Florida State. He was touched for two runs and six hits, including Dan Nespo's inside-the-park homer.

Stetson transfer Jerry Boxer came on in the sixth and after giving up three runs, held the Irish scoreless in the seventh and eighth frames. Ronnie Fraser finished up for the Seminoles.

Outfit for the fourth straight game—11-10 this time—FSU took advantage of Chuck Symson's wildness to gain the big lead in the first. Five walks and Phil Hunt's three-run double highlighted the sphree.

Carlee Hendrex led Florida State at the plate with a perfect night, collecting two singles and a triple.

Coach Danny Litwhiler sent 17 Tribe players into action.

In the best pitching performance of the tournament, Wisconsin's Schmidt struck out 12 and walked only one as he limited West Virginia's top seeded team to two hits.

The Badger's John DeMeritt batted in four runs and had three for five.

Wisconsin scored five times in the fourth on two hits.

EXTRA INNING

The Illinois - North Carolina game, second of the day for the Tarheels, went into an extra inning before third baseman Don

Lukaszewski hit a double in the bottom of the 10th to drive in the winning runs.

Bill Prentz, who went in as a relief pitcher for the Irish in the eighth, was credited with the victory.

Art Stone, who went the distance for North Carolina, was the winner over Notre Dame.

The Irish used three pitchers in their attempt to beat the Atlantic Coast Conference club. John Hammett, who was charged with the loss, was yanked before the first inning was over after he permitted three hits, walked two and hit a batter.

The Tarheels' big inning came in the first and third. They scored five runs on three hits in each.
