FSU scored both its runs on sacrifices yesterday as the Seminoles collected only five singles off Dick Smallwood, Duke's ace lefthander.

Avitable's squeeze bunt scored. Bob Rosell with the first run in the second inning. Rosell'led off with a walk, took second on Phil Hunt's bunt single and moved to third on Johnny Sheppard's fly.

WINNING RUN

Rosell's sacrifice fly scored Fred Twomey for the winning run in the sixth with one out. Twomey lined a one-bagger to center. He went to third on a single by Lee Corso.

The Seminoles "gave" Duke its lone run in the seventh. With two out, Bill Domhoff doubled to the rightfield fence, Avitable then struck out Bernie Blaney but Sheppard hesitated about throwing to first after scooping up the low pitch.

When Blaney took off-for-first. Sheppard fired to Twomey but Blaney beat him to the bag. In the meantime, Domhoff-had rounded third and scampered across the plate.
