

GASTONIA, N. C., June 2—Duke swept a doubleheader from Florida State here today to gain the NCAA District 3 playoff finals against Mississippi. The Blue Devils ousted FSU with 4-2 and 7-6 victories, winning the second game with a lone run in the tenth inning. Mississippi went into the championship game with a 3-2 win over Tennessee Tech, its second in a row.

Ole Miss and Duke open a best two out of three series Monday with the winner headed for Omaha, Neb., and the college world series.

Duke power was the difference as Andy Cockrell blasted a three-

run homer in the first game and Buddy Bass duplicated the feat in the nightcap.

WINNING RUN

In the tenth, FSU pitcher Tommy Garcia got his 12th strikeout of the contest before Cockrell lined a triple deep to right field. Garcia walked a man and then Lon Bonczek's ground ball was scooped up by shortstop Dick Howser who threw to the plate in an attempt to get Cockrell. But the Duke third baseman bowled into catcher Johnny Sheppard, forcing the Seminole backstop to drop the ball and Cockrell was safe with the winning run.

Florida State's Bob Rosell doubled with one out in the bottom of the tenth but Phil Hunt and Sheppard flied out, ending the game and FSU's chances.

Bass' three-run blast in the first inning put Duke out in front early but the Seminoles picked up two runs in the third and went ahead in the fourth with three more.

Carlee Hendrix' triple scored ~~one tally. Garcia's single drove~~ in another and Hendrix crossed the plate with FSU's fifth run on a double steal.

Fred Twomey tied it up again with a booming 380-foot homer over the fence in right-center.

IN FRONT AGAIN

Duke picked up one run in the sixth and went out in front 6-5 with two in the seventh on three hits, including Bernie Blaney's three baser.

But the Blue Devils finally forc-

ed Garcia out with the tenth frame run. Lefty Tony Avitable, who hurled a 2-1 Friday victory over Duke, finished the inning.

In the afternoon game Florida State left 10 men on bases.

The Seminoles scored once in the seventh on Howser's triple and added the second run in the eighth on a double by Hunt following a single by Lee Corso and Bob Rosell's fielder's choice.
