

Two explosive five-run eighth innings carried Duke and Michigan State into the second round of Florida State's Invitational Baseball Tourney today with one-game margins.

The Blue Devils, who downed Yale 8-4 and the Spartans, who topped the home-standing Seminoles, 8-3, meet at 3:00 today to determine who goes into the tournament lead.

The Seminoles and Yale meet in a 7:30 clash at Centennial Field, to round out the second day of play in the round robin tourney, which runs through Saturday night.

LEFTYS DO IT

Two free-wheeling southpaws, Dick Smallwood for Duke and Ron Perranoski for Michigan State shackled their opponents effectively, though Perranoski needed help during a wild eighth inning.

The Spartans' junior left-hander had the Seminole shut out with only three hits to that point, when his own error and three straight walks led to two FSU runs.

Sophomore Bob Rabias was brought on, but he promptly walked Pfil Hunt to force in the third Seminole tally. Rabias fanned Johnny Sheppard to end the inning, though and the Tribe didn't threaten in the ninth.

Michigan State jumped out in front on a single by Alan Luce, a ground out and a run-scoring single by Roscoe Davis. Then added two in the fifth, when Frank Palamara and Ted Kearly doubled and Luce singled.

WAY IT WAS

The five runs in the eighth were produced with five singles, aided by an error by Seminole first-sacker Fred Twomey and a walk by relief pitcher Rudy Elgie.

It was the last outing of the year for the Spartans' left-hander, who posted a 5-4 mark as a sophomore with the Spartans last year. He fanned eight while walking nine in his 1957 debut.

For the Seminoles it was the second straight loss against three wins. They dropped a 3-2 decision to Stetson in DeLand Saturday and now have managed only eight hits in the last 18 innings of play.

It was also the second loss in a row for right hander Fred Kenner, who went the first five innings last night and gave up three of the Michigan State runs.

STETSON LOSS

The junior hurler from West Palm Beach lost Saturday's battle to Stetson in relief. He stopped Auburn 8-2 in his first outing last Tuesday.

In the afternoon contest, the Duke Blue Devils used the home run power of left fielder Pete Maynard and pitcher Smallwood to score five times in the eighth and spring away from Yale, 8-4.

It was the third win of the season against no losses for Ace Parker's Blue Devils.

Smallwood, who posted a 6-2 mark last year, fanned 13 and gave up only seven hits to the Bulldogs. Both he and Maynard homered with a man on in the big five-run eighth.

Maynard had four for five for his afternoon's work, including another home run, in the second with nobody on. Track star Dave Sims, who plays center field for the baseballers, had three hits for the Blue Devils.

IN THE PINCH

Yale also had a home run, a pinch-hit blast by outfielder Derry Clay with a man on in the last of the ninth, but it was too late to overcome the Duke advantage.

The winners had only a 2-1 edge in a tight pitching duel between Smallwood and Yale's Ray Carlson until the fatal eighth.

Stetson led it off with an infield hit, went to second on a grounder, scored on a single by Danlevy. Maynard then pitched out and the Blue Devils led 1-0.

After a walk to Auburn's Ray Maynard, Smallwood pitched out Maynard's foul and the contest continued.
